

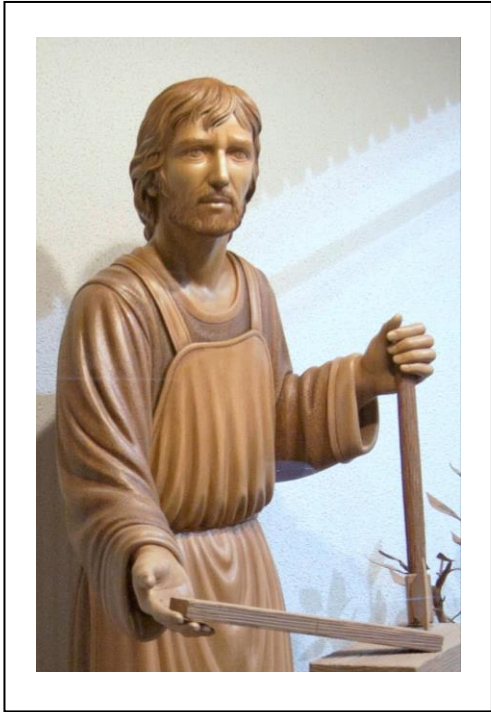

Helping victims of torture find safety in Canada - Torture, An Ongoing Crime is the subject of a talk by Dr. Wendell Block, of the Canadian Centre for Victims of Torture (CCVT), on **Saturday, Oct. 3. This free event, from 2 - 4pm** at St. Joseph's Parish Hall, 399 Victoria Ave. in Belleville, will shed light on the realities faced by individuals seeking safety in Canada after deeply traumatizing experiences. Dr. Block is a semi-retired family physician who divides his working time between serving rural patients at Tweed's Gateway Community Health Centre and supporting CCVT's vital humanitarian work in Toronto. Since 1986, he has committed himself to helping asylum seekers who have experienced severe trauma. His clinical assessments and professional documentation provide essential medical evidence for survivors requesting asylum in Canada. During his address, Dr. Block will share insights into the profound medical and social challenges these newcomers face, concluding the afternoon with an open Q & A session. Dr. Block's talk is sponsored by Amnesty International Quinte, Belleville for Justice & Peace, and Independent Jewish Voices.
